

John Lulman keelman Will 1637 NCC Wills Parke 239 MF411 - a summary

1. £3 to the poor of St Julian, 20s. p.a.
- 2 To Mary my wife all those houses from the great gate unto the houses of Nicholas Ellyett* with all within the yard where I now dwell
- 3 After Mary's death they go to Thomas Lulman, my son
- 4 The goods after Mary's death to be divided between my children
- 5 If Thomas dies before the age of 21 they then go to Robert Lulman, my son. Then to Robert Lulman, my son, all those houses from the great gate to the lane and so round to the backside? which was some time demised to Thomas Gibbs? The same within two years after my decease but the coalhouse and lower yard immediately upon condition that he shall pay unto Thomas Lulman, my son, the sum of £5 yearly and every year during the life of Mary my wife. If Robert does not survive until 21 then his portion goes to Thomas.
- 6 Also my keel I give to Mary my wife and to Robert my son to trade together
- 7 I give to Nicholas Lulman, my son, the houses ?? John Whitfield to enter them within 3 years after my death on condition that he and the occupiers pay £3 to Thomas Lulman a year whilst Mary is alive.
- 8 To the three children of Thomas Trappit £10 to be equally divided between them within 5 years after my land is sold at Chetgrave.
- 9 To the two children of Michael Lulman, my son, the sum of £10 to be divided between them and paid within 5 years of the sale of my Chetgrave land.
- 10 To Morgan Childes £10 within one year of my death
- 11 To Jane, wife of William Whitelaw, £4 within one year of my death.
- 12 To Robert Lulman, my son, £150 (£100 out of money from Chetgrave and £50 out of interest money
- 13 To Mary, my daughter wife of Thomas Trappit, £100 marks
- 14 To Job, my son, £80 within 4 years of the sale of Chetgrave, if he be dead and come not again, this to be divided among the others
- 15 To Michael Lulman, my son, the sum of £30 within 3 years 16 To Nicholas, my son, £20 within 4 years
- 17 To Thomas, my son, £40 within 5 years
- 18 To John, my son, £60 1
- 9 To Mary, my wife and Robert my son all the lands at Chetgrave
- 20 My executors to be Mary and Robert Witnesses Morgan Childe (mark), William Catterson and Nicholas Elliott senior*

the south to Nicholas Ellyet, beer brewer, and Hester Ellyett on 7/11th September 1619 (NRO NCR 1/35m.34). Blomefield says: 'In 1626, Nic. Elliot had it, and it after came to the Cooks; Thomas Cooke, Esq. being the present owner. (Blomefield IV, p.76). See 1730 for Thomas Cooke. The site was now in two parts again. Two tenements on the street frontage were probably let out. The rest of the southern section may have been used as an alehouse. Ellyet may have founded the "Three Merry Wherryemen" by this date - later the 'Old Barge Inn'. Ellyet is a witness to John Lulman's will of 1637. After the division of 1619 the term 'Middays' was only applied to this southern section, being used up to 1771".
